**eCycling Wisconsin** is a state-wide, manufacturer-funded program designed to encourage the recycling of electronic devices. Manufacturers are responsible for paying for the recycling of electronics, including:

- TVs
- Computers
- Printers
- Desktop printers
- Computer monitors, keyboards, mice and speakers
- · Cell phones
- Fax machines




